### **OVERVIEW**

The MDAT-GOG has been in operation since 20 June 16. It is a virtual reporting mechanism supporting the interregional architecture defined by the Yaounde Code of Conduct. The primary output from the MDAT-GoG is to contribute by maintaining coherent maritime situational awareness in the central and western African Maritime Space, with the ability to inform and support industry, contributing to the safety and security of the Mariner in the regional maritime domain.

All vessels are encouraged to report to the MDAT-GoG using the existing reporting formats. The information supplied by vessels will be treated as commercially confidential.

All details can be found on SHOM Chart 8801CSD or UKHO Chart Q6114, 30 June 2016, to allow vessels to report their vessels when transiting the revised Voluntary Reporting Area (VRA), also described on both security charts with the MDAT-GOG, using the email address <a href="mailto:watchkeepers@mdat-gog.org">watchkeepers@mdat-gog.org</a>. Phone number is monitored permanently (+33 298 22 88 88).

After several months of existence, it has been assessed useful to publish a Quarterly Report which would summarize all the events previously reported within the past Weekly reports or received later. We hope this could provide some helpful general overview concerning the events we have to face.



032 events have been reported to MDAT-GoG this quarter.

#### **Classification criterias**

- Sighting and Irregular activity: All suspicious information with no proof of intent to board the vessel.
- Suspicious approach: Close approach with intent to board the vessel.
- Attempted boarding: <u>Actual</u> attempt to board a vessel.
- > Boarding: Assailants board a vessel.
- Theft: Theft realized in territorial waters with no violence.
- Robbery: Theft realized in territorial waters with threat/violence to crew.
- Attack: Use of weapons by assailants at vessel.
- Kidnap: Crew taken off vessel by force.
- Hijack: Vessel taken by attacker, no longer under the control of the Master.



#### **DETAIL OF EVENTS**



#### 032/17 - ATTACK - On 30th March 2017, in position: 04°01.00N - 006°48.00E

In the early morning, a merchant vessel was attacked by unknown pirates.

#### 031/17 - ATTACK - On 29th March 2017, in position: 04°08.00N - 004°40.00E

At 12:50ZHrs MDAT-GoG received information about an attack on merchant vessel.

#### 030/17 - MISC - On 29th March 2017, in position: 00°30.31S - 007°31.58E

Authorities reported to MDAT-GoG that a vessel could have been involved in an incident

near Gabon. After further investigation, it appeared that vessel just was drifting. This event is so classified as a false alarm.

#### 029/17 - SIGHTING - On 19th March 2017, in position: 05°48.00N - 010°36.00W

A merchant vessel spotted a suspicious craft (yacht type) following her for 20 minutes.

Merchant vessel proceeded to evasive manoeuvers, then suspicious craft stopped and altered course.

#### 028/17 - SIGHTING - On 11th March 2017, in position: 05°59.90N - 001°13.50E

Merchant vessel anchored off Lome, Togo, spotted six suspicious small boats approaching

her. Even the fact that small boats were not fitted with nets, it appeared that small boats were fishing vessels.

#### 027/17 - SIGHTING - On 10th March 2017, in position: 03°58.47N - 000°23.49E

Merchant vessel spotted two long fast boats at a distance of 6NM, approaching with a speed

of 5kn. They were visible with binoculars. Vessel started engine and sailed by full speed. Fast boats then stopped proceeding. Due to large distance, MDAT-GoG had not enough information to classify this event.

#### 026/17 - ATTACK - On 10th March 2017, in position: 03°03.00N - 006°57.30E

Merchant vessel has been attacked by a fast boat fitted with six gunmen. Assailants shot the

vessel and tried to board with a long ladder. Assault was aborted after evasive manoeuvers.

#### 025/17 - SIGHTING - On 9th March 2017, in position: 05°35.47N - 002°30.05E

Merchant vessel enroute to SSA Lagos observed a suspicious boat (black hull) at a

distance of 2.2 NM. The boat reduced it speed, stopped and waited for the vessel to come its beam (range 1.5) NM). The vessel increased speed to full and made large course alteration and started fire pump to activate the fire hoses rigged on deck and the boat appeared to follow the vessels astern. As the vessel was slightly faster, the distance increased and the boat aborted and moved away after nearly half an hour. After investigation, it appeared that boat was a fishing vessel.



#### 024/17 - SIGHTING - On 9th March 2017, in position: 15°39.00N - 018°20.00W

Merchant vessel sighted one skiff that came within 2-4 cables of vessel, no person on board

sighted or anything else.



#### 023/17 - ATTACK - On 8th March 2017, in position: 03°16.00N - 004°31.00E

Merchant vessel was attacked by a skiff with 7 pirates armed on board. Attack failed.

#### 022/17 - KIDNAP - On 7th March 2017, in position: 04°38.00N - 005°25.00E

According to sources operating in the region, a merchant vessel has been attacked and

boarded by an unknown number of assailants, when operating 7NM from the Pennington oil Terminal. The assailants have kidnapped the Captain, Chief Engineer, Chief Mate and one Able Seaman. It has been reported that the pirates have also stolen mobile phones, laptops and food supplies.



#### 021/17 - BOARDING - On 7th March 2017, in position: 04°41.00N - 007°09.00E

Merchant vessel reported several men boarded the vessel, whilst berthed at ONNE

PORT, Nigeria.

Assailants beat the Captain, who has been injured.

# <u>020/17 - SIGHTING - On 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2017, in position: 04°28.10N - 002°30.60E</u>

Crew on board a general cargo vessel underway noticed a suspicious boat doing 9

knots at a distance of 0.9NM astern. The vessel increased speed and made large course alterations and the boat appeared to follow. As the vessel was slightly faster, the distance increased and the boat aborted and moved away after nearly two hours.

# 019/17 - IRREGULAR ACTIVITY - On 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2017, in position: 05°15.80N - 011°06.10W

Merchant vessel has been followed by one suspicious vessel carrying two small boats. Suspicious vessel approached at about 5NM. Except the fact that vessel was followed, nothing was reported suspicious.



# <u>018/17 - IRREGULAR ACTIVITY - On 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2017, in position: 03°02.00N - 002°06.00W</u>

Merchant vessel spotted one suspicious boat heading straight with a speed of 4.5kt at a distance of 4.8 NM. Vessel started engine and run away from the boat, who increased speed and chased her for few minutes. Closest Point of Approach was 2NM. MDAT-GoG had not enough information to provide advisory/warning or to classify this event as an illegal event.



# <u>017/17 - SEARCH AND RESCUE - On 20<sup>th</sup> February 2017, in position: 05°50.83N - 010°02.75W</u>

Authorities requested information on a 110 tons vessel with 6 persons on board. EPIRB button has been pressed and thought to be in GOG area. After investigation, it appeared that vessel had sunk on the morning off Buchanan, Liberia. All crew safe.



#### <u>016/17 - ATTACK - On 19<sup>th</sup> February 2017,</u> in position: 05°13.80N - 004°49.50E

Merchant vessel had been attacked when sailing offshore FORCADOS at about 28 NM

from the shore. 6 or 7 armed pirates came on board. The ship received assistance from Nigerian naval asset but pirates had already gone. Crew staid in citadel for 8 hours and are all safe.

#### <u>015/17 - ROBBERY - On 18<sup>th</sup> February</u> <u>2017, in position: 05°12.80N - 004°04.40W</u>

Merchant Vessel was boarded by robbers. They threatened the crew with knives, two mooring lines were stolen, and no crew member was injured.

### <u>014/17 - SEARCH AND RESCUE - On 18<sup>th</sup></u> <u>February 2017, in position: 17°40.52S - 011°24.93E</u>

UKMTO informed MDAT-GoG that a crew member was over board. This event took place out of VRA. MRCC CAPE TOWN took the lead.



### <u>013/17 - IRREGULAR ACTIVITY - On 13<sup>th</sup></u> <u>February 2017, in position: 04°45.70N - 003°38.70E</u>

Merchant vessel reported a small general cargo ship, with small boat alongside on port quarter, which was drifting. Vessel was too far to see something suspicious on board. MDAT-GoG had not enough information to provide advisory/warning or to classify this event.



# <u>012/17 – ATTACK – On 7<sup>th</sup> February 2017, in</u> position: 03°31.00N - 007°04.00E

VHF distress message is relayed to MDAT-GoG. A merchant vessel has been attacked by at least two fast boats.

# <u>011/17 – KIDNAP – On 5<sup>th</sup> February 2017, in position: 03°58.00N - 005°28.00E</u>

Merchant vessel was attacked by 3 fast boats. Ten pirates armed with automatic guns came

on board the vessel. Intruders stayed about 2 hours before leaving, taking with them electronic devices and cash. 8 Crew members were abducted.

## <u>010/17 – ATTACK – On 4<sup>th</sup> February 2017, in</u> position: 02°54.24N - 004°51.54E

One small skiff with eight personnel armed with weapons approached a merchant vessel and escort vessel at a high speed and opened fire. Escort vessel returned warning shots and skiff retreated. All vessels are safe.

#### <u>009/17 – ATTACK – On 30<sup>th</sup> January 2017, in</u> <u>position: UNKNOWN</u>

An attack reported to have occurred off Bonny Island LNG Terminal in the early morning.

During the attack, one security boat would have sustained damage.



## <u>008/17 – THEFT – On 30<sup>th</sup> January 2017, in</u> position: 08°27.00N - 013°26.00W

Two supposed-thieves boarded the vessel. They jumped overboard whilst general alarm sounded. Nothing was reported stolen. MDAT-GoG cannot confirm if assailants were thieves or stowaways. (MDAT-GoG Weekly Report 05-17 and Advisory



001/JAN/17)

#### <u>007/17 - STOWAWAYS - On 26<sup>th</sup> January</u> <u>2017, in position: 32°39.00N - 009°23.00W</u>

A merchant vessel out of VRA reported 5 stowaways on board. The ship changed her destination to disembark them.



#### <u>006/17 – ROBBERY – On 25<sup>th</sup> January 2017,</u> in position: 08°27.00N - 013°25.00W

Three assailants with knives boarded a bulk carrier anchored in Pepel anchorage. The assailants were spotted on the vessel's forecastle and the alarm was raised. According to reports, the assailants threatened one crew member before escaping with stolen ship's store.

#### <u>005/17 – ROBBERY – On 25<sup>th</sup> January 2017,</u> <u>in position: 08°27.00N - 013°25.00W</u>

Three robbers on board a small wooden boat boarded a merchant vessel anchored.

They stole mooring rope before being spotted and escaping.



# <u>004/17 – HIJACK – On 19<sup>th</sup> January 2017, in</u> position: 04°58.57N - 008°19.21E

Merchant vessel was reported to have been hijacked by pirates off Calabar (Cross River States, Nigeria).

Seven crew members were on board. MDAT tried to contact company but has not enough information to provide advisory/warning or to classify this event.



### <u>003/17 - IRREGULAR ACTIVITY - On 11<sup>th</sup></u> <u>January 2017, in position: 02°01.00N - 000°23.00W</u>

Merchant vessel reported a suspicious boat while she was drifting. Vessel started engine and got underway. Small thin fishing boat then stopped chasing her.

### <u>002/17 - SEARCH AND RESCUE - On 6<sup>th</sup></u> <u>January 2017, in position: 03°01.00S - 005°37.00W</u>

Authorities contacted MDAT to request assistance for sailor with several fractures on board a fishing vessel. Information was released to local authorities and dealt with by them.



### <u>001/17 - IRREGULAR ACTIVITY - On 4<sup>th</sup></u> <u>January 2017, in position: 04°53.00N - 000°43.00W</u>

Merchant vessel received a call from supposed Ghana Navy (VHF16). He decided not to reply to them and proceeded to her destination.
