PROHIBITION OF CREW CHANGE IN SINGAPORE FOR CREW WITH RECENT TRAVEL HISTORY TO BANGLADESH, INDIA, NEPAL, PAKISTAN AND SRI LANKA

- 1. The Ministry of Health (MOH) has announced that all long-term pass holders and short-term visitors with recent travel history (including transit) to Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka within the last 21 days will <u>not</u> be allowed entry into Singapore, or transit through Singapore.
- 2. In line with the above, please be informed that the following crew change will not be allowed in the Port of Singapore:
 - a) Crew with recent travel history to Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka within the last 21 days preceding arrival to Singapore. This includes sign-on crew travelling to Singapore by flight as well as sign-off crew from vessels that have called at Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka.
 - b) Sign-on crew transiting Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka on their connecting flights to Singapore.
- 3. The above measure is effective from 7 May 2021, 2359 hours.

- 5. This circular is to be read in conjunction with Port Marine Circular No. 14 of 2021. This circular supersedes Port Marine Circulars No. 2, 12 and 13 of 2021.
