## PROHIBITION OF CREW CHANGE IN SINGAPORE FOR CREW WITH RECENT TRAVEL HISTORY TO THE UNITED KINGDOM AND SOUTH AFRICA

- 1. The Ministry of Health has announced that from 3 January 2021, 2359 hours, all long-term pass holders and short-term visitors with recent travel history to South Africa within the last 14 days will <u>not</u> be allowed entry into Singapore, or transit through Singapore. This is in addition to similar border restrictions imposed on travellers from the United Kingdom (UK) from 23 December 2020, 2359 hours.
- 2. In line with the above, please be informed that the following crew change will not be allowed in the Port of Singapore:
  - a) Crew with recent travel history to the UK or South Africa within the last 14 days preceding arrival to Singapore. This includes sign-on crew travelling to Singapore by flight as well as sign-off crew from vessels that have called at these countries.
  - b) Sign-on crew transiting the UK and South Africa on their connecting flights to Singapore.
- 3. The above measures for crew with travel history to the UK or South Africa are effective from 23 December 2020, 2359 hours and 3 January 2021, 2359 hours respectively.

- 5. This circular supersedes Port Marine Circular No. 46 of 2020. It is to be read in conjunction with Port Marine Circular No. 42 of 2020.
